

## **Participation mandate**

### **What does the consultation consist of?**

As part of the construction of the 2032 strategic plan, CentraleSupélec is bringing together all its stakeholders through this consultation. Whether you are a student, a staff member, an alumni, a corporate partner, an academic partner, or a research partner, your voice counts. By participating, you will contribute your expertise to the deployment plan for the next ten years.

### **What do participants agree to?**

All participants agree that CentraleSupélec may reuse the ideas they propose within the survey framework.

The survey must be carried out with a spirit of respect towards all individuals, the common interest, and a spirit of goodwill. Contributions must therefore be written in a constructive tone.

The survey is proposed with the goal of generating collective value. Each participant is invited to express themselves in all sincerity, expose their point of view freely, and to make proposals.

Contributions may not contain sensitive data (sex, racial or ethnic origin, political, philosophical, or religious opinions, trade union membership, data relating to health or sex life, offenses, convictions, security measures).

Contributions whose behavior is contrary to this mandate may not be taken into account in the final analysis.

### **What does CentraleSupélec commit to?**

CentraleSupélec is committed to applying the principles of equality, transparency, and auditability to the participants' contributions and the data collected

Each contribution to the consultation will be read and allow CentraleSupélec to feed its strategic plan for the next ten years.

Each participant's contribution benefits from equal treatment (1 contribution = 1 vote).

Participants' expressions (individual and collective) will be reproduced in their own words, without reformulation. They will be analyzed and reported according to a method that will be made public.

The results of the consultation will be distributed to the participants.
